## **Building works**

The conversion of the IT suite into a classroom was completed this week. These works were a couple of weeks overdue so Class 1 have been camping out in the hall but will be moving into their very nice new room on Thursday.



The conversion of Class 15 into 2 new classrooms is progressing. Most of the big work such as foundations and the demolition of the external wall have been completed and there has been little noise or disruption to the pupils. These works are due to be completed in November. We are hoping that the builders' compound in the KS1 playground can be reduced soon so we can reclaim more outside space.

# Attendance/October Half Term

Our overall attendance was slightly above national average last year for the first time since the pandemic. The biggest negative effect on attendance is term time holidays. You may be aware that the October 2024 half term in Waltham Forest, which is what the school went with when setting our term dates, is a week earlier than the majority of the country and begins Mon 21<sup>st</sup>. Coupled with this, Chingford Foundation School, have moved to a 2 week half term meaning they are also off the week beginning the 28<sup>th</sup>. Please try and book any holidays in the week that is Yardley's half term...if the Center Parc's website is anything to go by, they will be cheaper on those dates anyway.

## Reminders

The now traditional list of reminders to parents and pupils of things to do and not to do...

- No dogs are to be brought into the school grounds at anytime (with the exception of assistance dogs).
- No leather footballs in the playgrounds please. They can be used on the field after school.
- If your child comes by bike or scooter, please ask them to dismount when entering the KS1 or KS2 playgrounds. As part of the re-modelling works, there will be a brand-new scooter park at the lower end of KS1 playground which will be an improvement on the current area behind the canteen.
- Please, please, please label your child's clothing, shoes and other items (bags, water bottles etc) with their name. Pupils need a PE kit, including change of footwear, in school at all times.
- Earrings should be of the stud variety only and not hooped.
- Any pupils with long hair need to have a hairband on them to tie it back for PE.
- No nuts to be brought to school in packed lunches or as snacks.
- Parents should not be driving into school at any time during the school day. We do allow parents to drive in after 5pm if collecting from Wraparound care as after school clubs will have finished by then and pupils will not be on site.
